IT RESOURCES

The University is adequately equipped with computer systems. Each college has dedicated computer lab(s) equipped with general as well as domain specific software for quality teaching and research.

Microsoft ERP installed to automate various administrative processes of the university. The University is proud to be a part of the National Knowledge Network (NKN), an initiative of the Department of Science and

Technology and Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, which connects universities of the country through high speed internet to share knowledge, learning experiences and academic resources.

Additionally, use of Skype and other technology helps eliminate distances and dissolve boundaries, with eminent experts available to interact with students and faculty, allowing for a free flow of knowledge.

THE LANGUAGE LABS

4 State-of-the-art language labs with 240 computer terminals equipped with hi-tech software, to help develop basic, intermediate and business level language skills. In addition, these labs have personality development cabins and group discussion rooms for students to interact with their peer groups, for discussions and debate, allowing them to grow holistically.

HOSTEL

There are four separate hostels for boys and girls to accommodate approximately 4600 students. Rooms are spacious, clean, airy and well maintained with attached bathrooms and are available on single as well sharing basis. Each room is furnished with beds, wardrobes, study tables and chairs, air coolers have also been provided for each room. Round-the-clock power back-up facility is available in the campus. Air conditioned rooms are made available on request. Solar heaters have been installed for providing hot water during winters. Water purifiers and water coolers have been installed to provide potable water.

Each Hostel has a provision for a visitor's room, a spacious well-lit common room with large screen television and comfortable seating arrangement, recreational facilities, equipments for indoor games, newspapers & magazines, wi-fi connectivity and a gymnasium/Laundry facilities are available in-house with provision for commercial washing machine and tumble drier.

CAFETERIA

Besides Central Mess facilities and well maintained canteens, 'Talk of the Town' has been started for providing hygienic, moderately priced and delicious food items to the students. Indian, Chinese & Italian dishes are also part of menu in this restaurant.
