The seminars, conferences and extension lectures are organised on a regular basis and as many as 32 guest lectures, 31 workshops, Seminars, Conferences were organized during the reporting period. During the session 21 new programmes of study were introduced and the enrolment of the students grew by 36% over last year, proportionately there was increase in the strength of the faculty to 631.

For multi dimensional growth of its learners, the university has been actively promoting cultural and sports activities. A three day cultural event Rock On-IV, SPICMACAY sponsored Oddissi dance performance by noted Oddissi exponent Sh. Vijay Sahoo, are some of the important events organized in the series.

Along with academic activities we recognise our social responsibility and have organized a number of free medical and dental check-up camps and other awareness campaigns to contribute for healthy India. 

Well maintained cars are being used for administrative work and for picking/dropping our guests visiting the University. Ambulance services on 24 hrs. basis are available for patients in the hospital. Critical care ambulance is always ready for shifting patients to Delhi and other places.






